Casual workers disrupt Pikitup services after contracts expire

Pikitup services will be disrupted in some parts of the City of Johannesburg as casual workers, whose contracts are about to expire, are forcefully demanding jobs from the waste management company.

Currently, casual workers and community members residing around the Norwood, Marlboro, Waterval, Selby, Randburg, Midrand and Diepsloot depots are protesting outside the gates, preventing Pikitup employees from servicing residents. Some workers have resorted to burning tires outside of some depots.

Pikitup Management is actively exploring various options to normalise the situation and restore service delivery in the affected depot areas. Efforts include engaging with protesting casual workers to find amicable solutions and deploying security measures that will enable employees to leave the depots to service the community.

A recovery plan is also being devised to ensure that the waste collection backlogs that will be occasioned by the present situation are addressed speedily

Pikitup sincerely apologises for any inconvenience caused by the ongoing service disruptions and reassures residents that it is working diligently to resolve the issue.
